## There is also specific work that is being offered by English and Maths:

## **English**

During this academic year students have been studying Jekyll and Hyde by Robert Louis Stevenson, as this is one of the texts they will be assessed on in their GCSE Literature exam. During the summer break it would be hugely beneficial for them to revise the text. Below are a selection of things that pupils can do to revise the text:



- Re-read Jekyll and Hyde all pupils have their own copy (we do not recommend watching a film version as they all differ greatly from the text)
- Create flash cards of the key quotes for each chapter
- · Create flash cards for all the areas on the Knowledge Organiser

## **Maths**

Students recently completed an assessment on their most recent algebra work. Their teachers will use this information to plan some of their teaching for next year so that common difficulties are addressed at class level. Students should also address their own individual "weak spots", and we will help them to do this **using Sparx Maths**. In the coming days, their teachers will give them a personalised list of areas to work on before September, linked to the Independent Learning clip numbers on Sparx. Please encourage them to spend an hour per week on these tasks so that they are well prepared for the final, and most difficult, areas of the curriculum next year. Please also remember that Thursday after-school revision will begin in the very first week.

As with all new terms we will start with reminding the students of school expectations in terms of behaviour, attendance, punctuality, uniform and equipment. Mr Wileman will be sending a communication to you around uniform and equipment. Please let me know if you have any questions about this. It would be great to start next year with all students well-equipped and in perfect uniform so that we can focus on preparing them for the important year ahead.
