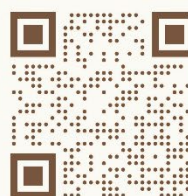

Abingdon GCSE Astronomy Group



The group consists of pupils from any school in Abingdon who are interested in following a GCSE course in Astronomy. Some pupils choose to take the GCSE exam after two or three years of study, but some just attend out of interest and to learn more about the subject. The classes are held in the Yang Science Centre at Abingdon School at the Faringdon Road entrance between 4-5pm on Mondays in Abingdon School's term time. Pupils from Y10-Y13 may attend. They may choose to sit the GCSE exam at the end of Y11, Y12 or Y13. It can be done in a year, but will involve lots of self-study.

The first session will be on Monday 15th September.

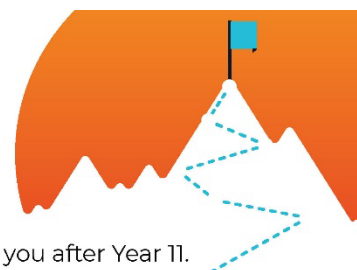
