Dear families,

It feels very late to be wishing you a Happy New Year so welcome to Term 3. We have enjoyed welcoming students back into school and whilst spring is still a long way off there is a feeling of renewal, growth and change.

We started our morning celebration assemblies this week with Year 9, Year 8 and Year 7. Making these assemblies weekly instead of termly seems very appropriate given the vast number of achievements our students are managing between them every week. As well as collecting positive behaviour points students have been given reward slips and over 250 have been handed in to student services so far and go into our prize draw next week.

We have gone one step further in ensuring that our school is a mobile phone free zone. Students are being asked to make sure their phones are switched off as they arrive at school and this is resulting in fewer distractions and fewer examples of negative behaviour linked to phones. In time I know that as we reduce the use of these devices across the school it will have a positive impact on the community.

Across the site we are continuing to look at ways to improve students' experiences at social times and will continue to use their feedback to make more positive changes.
