These exams are a last chance for students get used to the process of sitting an external exam as well as a chance to gauge the level that they are working at.


Year 11 students can find their exam timetables on their Bromcom ap and on MCAS. Revision strategies and resources <u>here</u>.

STEM Club

Last week STEM Club were looking into the Penguin Huddle method. This practical is a model for penguins insulating themselves by huddling together. When they are by themselves, they will lose body heat quickly, however when they huddle together, they insulate each

other, reducing the heat loss. They will then shuffle themselves occasionally, so the same penguins aren't always on the outside.





The students got into groups and recorded the temperature of water in

a single boiling tube compared to the temperature of water in a group of boiling tubes over 10 minutes. Their results showed that even though the temperature dropped in both sets the group

(huddle) of boiling tubes stayed warmer for longer.

This week we will be sticking with the cold theme and making hand warmers.
