






Be inspired by the creativity of young minds.

Show your stripes was created by Professor Ed Hawkins from the University of Reading in 2018 to represent the climate crisis in stripes of colours. Each stripe represents the average temperature for a single year, relative to the average temperature over the period as a whole. Shades of blue indicate cooler-than-average years, while red shows years that were hotter than average. The STEM department ran a competition for students to be creative and design their own stripes. 
For the past 3 weeks STEM club have been working hard engineering Hydraulic Lifts.
