Dear families,

As we head into our last week before a well-earned Half Term break, I would like to recognise the huge amount of hard work that students and teachers have put in so far. It has been fantastic for me getting to know our school and spending time visiting lessons and seeing students engaged and enjoying their learning.

Of course, the John Mason community extends far beyond students and teachers. We value the input we receive from you as family members both through the feedback provided and the support you lend us, encouraging your children to be the best they can be.

If you would like to become more involved in the John Mason School community then there are many opportunities and I would like to pass on a message from our Chair of Governors, Sam Gosling:

Could you be a Governor?

Are you interested in being a Governor at John Mason? We are currently hoping to recruit additional governors to the Local Academy Committee. John Mason governors are responsible for supporting the Head and Leadership Team to improve the school further.

Our primary role is to read carefully the reports we receive from the school about its work, to ask good questions, and to visit the school. The minimum time commitment is six meetings a year – these are usually held face to face at 17:30pm on a Wednesday, and last for one and a half hours. There is also a planned programme of visits to the school, and occasional requests to take part in panel work (for example, dealing with complaints or permanent exclusions).

The key requirements are enthusiasm and an interest in helping to improve the school. This is not an elected post – we have already filled those. Our year 7 students are coming to the end of a term of MFL taster sessions in our four languages, French, German, Mandarin and Spanish. The teachers have thoroughly enjoyed sharing their passions with students and hope they have enjoyed it too.

Next week all Year 7 students will be asked to select their two favourite languages. Immediately after half term they will start with one of their chosen languages, picking up the second in year 8.

Homework

A reminder that all homework is set on BromCom (Google Classroom for JMF6) and that parents can view this on the MCAS app. Students in Years 7-9 are expected to do between 30 and 45 minutes of homework per subject, per week. In Years 10 and 11 this rises to 1 hour. Please monitor your child's homework and allow them to stop working on a particular homework if they have genuinely worked for this amount of time on it – unless of course they are enjoying it and want to continue!

Our aim is always to support students to complete their homework rather than issue consequences. There is a homework club in the Library on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school until 4:10pm, as well as several lunchtime support clubs run by subject experts. If a student needs help with their homework, this is the place to come to ask a teacher and it is where we will ask students to come along for support if the deadline has passed and homework is still not fully complete.
