Curriculum News

Physical Education Curriculum Update:

Students have made a fantastic start in their PE lessons this academic year. We have also been blown away by the amount of students participating in our extensive extra-curricular offer. Just this week we had over 100 students playing sport on Wednesday after school as-well as fixtures on Tuesday and clubs running at lunch times.



We have also started our Sports Leaders programme for this academic year. Students will be supporting and leading the Primary cross country event next week and we have a packed programme for the remainder of the academic year. We will soon be launching our application process to be part of this programme and students will find out more via their daily slide in Term 2.

We have implemented a new process at the start of lessons which aims to increase activity time in class. '3-5-2' refers to students arriving in PE within 3 minutes, changing in 5 and being registered in 2. This then gives students maximum learning and activity time and we have really enjoyed seeing the benefits of this already.

We have also introduced a new curriculum, ensuring students rotate around many different activity areas and in Key Stage 4 offer a 'competitive' and 'participation' pathway that students can self-elect.

In Key Stage 3, we have introduced a strong emphasis on learning skills in the different activity areas. As part of our 'ME in PE' initiative, lessons and schemes of work focus on 5 developmental areas: Physical, Leading, Creative, Healthy and Thinking. Students are assessed in each of these areas and also self-assess against these areas.

Our curriculum has been mapped out for the year to cover a wide range of activities but also include House sport opportunities including our famous Country Dancing in December!

Each sport now has progressive skills mapped so that students can understand what level they are performing at based on the sills they can perform and how these increase in difficulty through from Year 7 to 9.

In GCSE PE (for Years 10 and 11), we have introduced a new marking and feedback process that gives specific targeted feedback to students that requires students to respond in order to improve their understanding and answers.

We will be holding our first ever sports awards evening later in the spring/ summer and look forward to celebrating may of the success stories of our clubs, teams and students at this event.

Welcome to Year 11, a pivotal year for your child, filled with important milestones and opportunities. As we begin, I want to highlight some key dates and the support available to help every student succeed. Over the coming months, students will take part in revision days, pre-public exams and of course their GCSEs. Events such as the Sixth Form Open Evening and Leavers' Day are designed to guide students through their next steps and celebrate their achievements.

Some key dates for your diary include: our dedicated revision morning on 14th October, and the start of pre-public exams on 10th November and again on 5th February. The Sixth Form Open Evening will be held on 27th November, with Parents' Evening following on 18th December. GCSE exams begin in April/May, and we look forward to celebrating at Leavers' Day and Prom on 26th June. Results Day is scheduled for 20th August.

Supporting your child's learning is a team effort. We encourage regular use of revision resources, including the John Mason School revision website, Seneca and Physics & Maths Tutor. Teachers will provide feedback, exam technique guidance and extra help where needed. At home, your support is invaluable, providing encouragement, a quiet space to study and emotional reassurance can make a real difference.

Wellbeing is just as important as academic progress. Our pastoral team, personal development sessions and assemblies are all in place to support students' mental health. Attendance is also crucial; students who attend regularly are far more likely to achieve their goals. Careers advice, apprenticeship workshops, and enrichment activities will be available throughout the year to help your child plan for life after Year 11.

John Mason School Local Academy Committee: October update

Reflecting on my first year as Chair of Governors at John Mason I would like to thank everyone for making me so welcome and particularly to thank Governor colleagues for all their support and work through a busy year during which the Local Academy Committee:



- Considered school leaders' plans to progress our agreed improvement
 goals focusing on improving learning and teaching, celebrating positive attitudes for behaviour and
 attendance and refining the school's systems to secure continual improvement and success for all
 students;
- Used data, reports and stakeholder feedback to question leaders on the progress of their action plans;
- Reviewed proposals to develop the curriculum to ensure that students can access a wide range of subjects for GCSE while also building strong foundations in Maths and English;
- Received reports from Abingdon Learning Trust and school leaders on the school's work to support vulnerable learners, raise standards and promote good attendance;
- Visited the school to see the school's teaching and learning strategies in practice and learn more about how teachers adapt approaches to meet differing needs;
- Approved policies to ensure that statutory responsibilities are met, expectations are high and processes for support and follow up are clear;
- Heard the views of students and staff about how the school works to keep everyone safe and
 considered how the school uses feedback received through student, parent and staff surveys to
 inform improvement plans;
- Developed the Local Academy Committee by recruiting new Governors and completing training to help us support and challenge the work of school leaders.

At the first meeting this year it was a pleasure to reflect on the impact of this work and congratulate last year's exam year groups and staff for their successes on results day. Alongside the academic achievements Governors were also delighted to hear of the school's success in recruiting new staff to join our learning community.

September's meeting also saw us looking to the future; reviewing the school's vision, to confirm high ambitions for all students and to celebrate the school's diversity, history and potential. We also considered and agreed school leaders' priorities for the new year to continue the improvement journey and tackle the challenges that John Mason School, and so many schools nationally, face including irregular patterns of student attendance and some students finding it hard to meet expectations for behaviour.

Supported by Abingdon Learning Trust's central team and professional partnerships with other schools a lot of work is in progress to move improvement plans forward and to learn from and address problems encountered along the way with determination as we maintain our focus on encouraging and supporting every student to succeed.
