Parent Bulletin

Dear families,

It has been a highly successful and productive term at John Mason School, with students embracing a wide range of opportunities both within and beyond the classroom. Across subjects, students have demonstrated commitment and ambition, from the Junior Maths Challenge and Science Vertex trips to the Made in Oxford Business and Enterprise Showcase and the Year 7 BSL Song Challenge.

In PE, House Rounders provided a fantastic opportunity for teamwork, resilience and healthy competition, while the Sports Awards Evening recognised the dedication and achievement of our Year 10 and 11 students. As part of the OX14 partnership, Year 10 students represented Abingdon in a historic cricket match, while Year 9 students took part in SupportEd, further broadening their experiences and working alongside peers from local schools.

Alongside these wider opportunities, students have shown real focus in their academic work. Year 10 students approached their mock examinations with maturity, while Year 8 and Year 9 students completed their assessments with increasing independence and resilience. Year 10 students have also made excellent progress through the Duke of Edinburgh Award, developing independence and confidence. As we continue with GCSE and A Level examinations, this marks an important point that reflects the sustained effort and determination of our students throughout their school journey.

What is particularly pleasing is the culture that underpins these successes. A significant number of students have improved their attendance, reflecting a strong commitment to their education and readiness to learn. Collectively, this term has demonstrated that our students are willing to challenge themselves, take opportunities, and strive for success, and this is something of which we are all very proud.

This week has provided further opportunity to celebrate our school community. Our Spring Concert was a particular highlight, showcasing the talent, confidence and creativity of our students. It was wonderful to see such a range of performances, from newly formed groups to more established bands developing their craft. We would also like to thank all families who attended the Year 10 Parents' Evening; your support is invaluable as students prepare for the next stage of their studies.

As we continue the examination period, we would like to remind Year 11 and Year 13 students of the importance of rest, balance and taking time to recharge over the coming days. Following the success and popularity of our provision this term, we are pleased to confirm that breakfast will continue to be available for all students from 8:45am on every morning of the examination period when students return in June.

Finally, we are delighted to celebrate those students who have received their Year Group Values Awards for demonstrating opportunity, respect and determination. These students

exemplify the very best of our school community. Congratulations to Stert House for winning the Term 5 House Quiz, and to Ock House for gaining an outstanding number of achievement points this term and for leading on attendance so far this year. Congratulations once again to Stert, who are currently leading the House Cup competition for Term 5.

Curriculum News

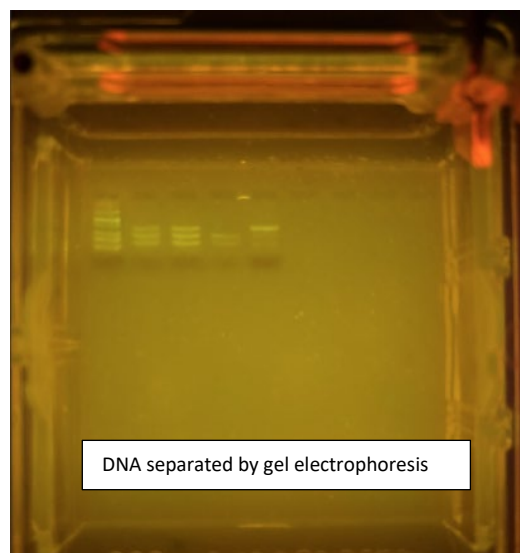
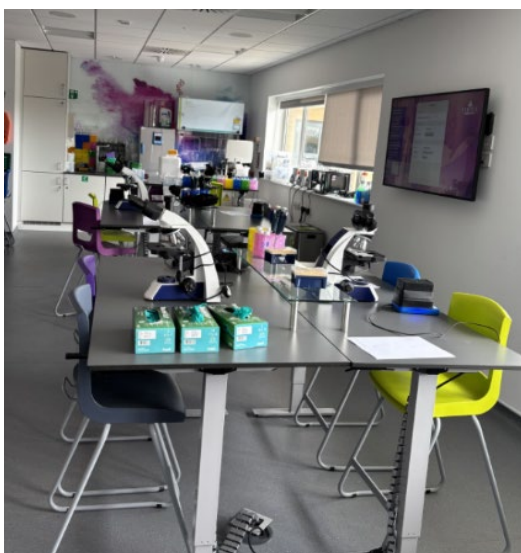
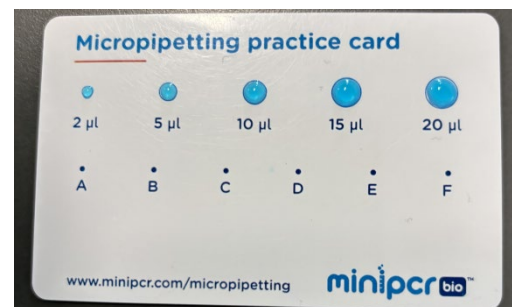
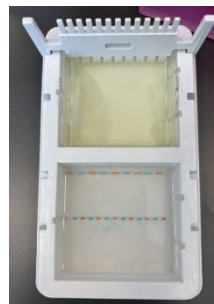
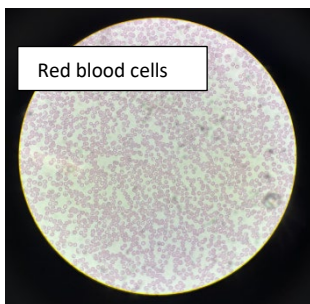
Year 10 students recently enjoyed an exciting and educational visit to Vertex Pharmaceuticals in Didcot. The trip was designed to consolidate topics studied in Year 10 Biology and support students as they prepare for the transition into Year 11.

Throughout the day, students were given the opportunity to see how the scientific knowledge they learn in the classroom is applied in real-world medical and research settings. The visit aimed to deepen students' understanding of Biology while also inspiring them by highlighting the wide range of career opportunities available within the pharmaceutical and biotechnology industries.

A key part of the visit focused on identifying genetic disorders in humans through the use of DNA gel electrophoresis. Students took part in practical activities that simulated the work of real scientists, analysing DNA samples to investigate inherited conditions. This hands-on experience directly supported future Year 11 learning on DNA, inheritance, and genetic disorders.

The activities allowed students to:

- Apply their classroom knowledge in a professional laboratory environment.
- Develop practical scientific and analytical skills.
- Gain a deeper understanding of inheritable disorders and DNA analysis.
- Explore how biotechnology is used to improve healthcare and diagnose disease.
- Learn about potential future STEM careers.

Well done to our Year 10 students for completing their first DofE practice expedition, showing excellent resilience every step of the way!

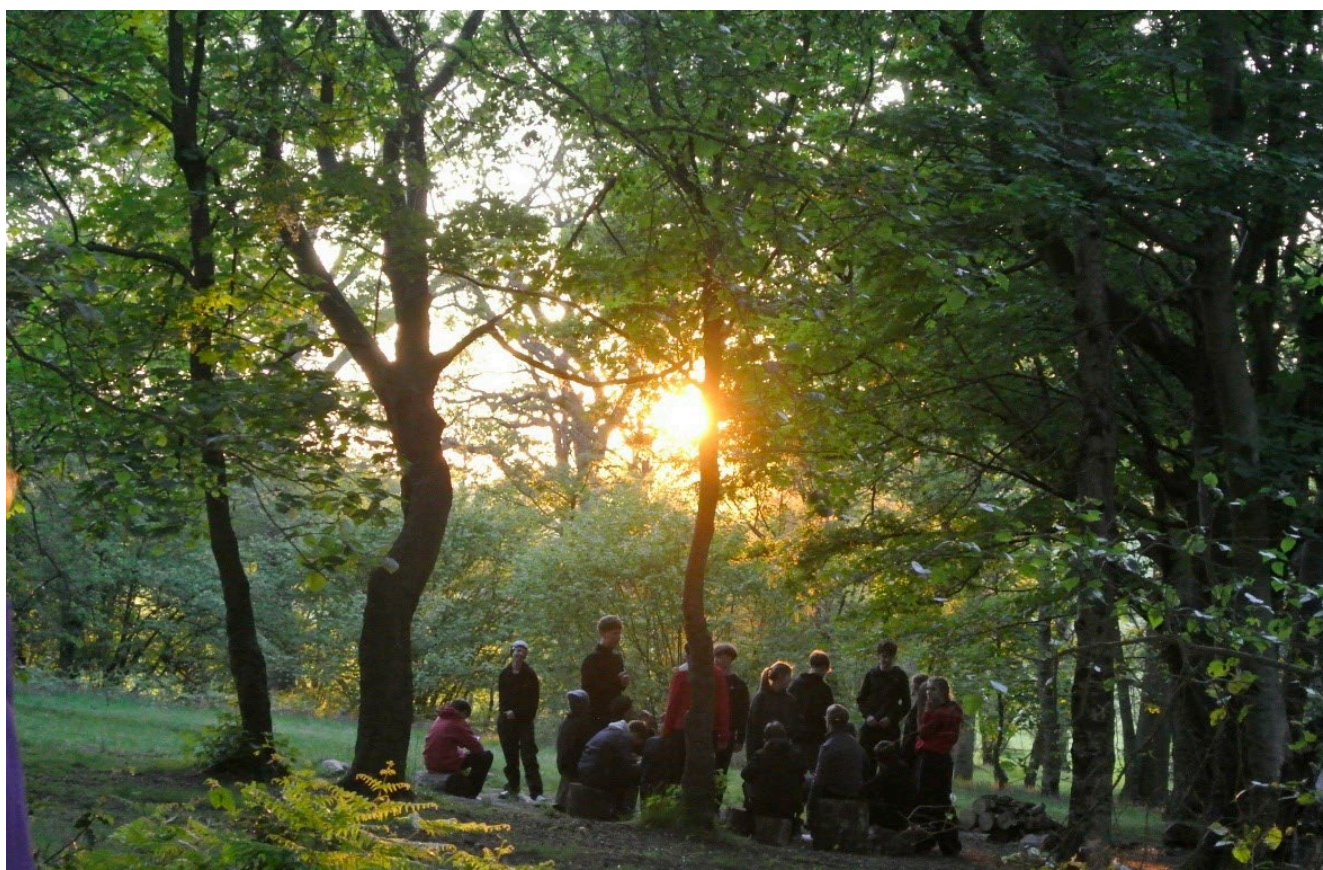
