Thames Water Visit

All of Year 9 were visited by Thames Water and a company called Debate Mate on Wednesday 4th February. Year 9 were off timetable for the day in their tutor groups and took part in a range of engaging and exciting activities.

The visitors informed students about global issues such as water security and the consequences of not having access to water locally. Debate Mate also worked with students to develop their debating skills. The topic debated was whether or not the reservoir near Abingdon should be built.

Following this, GARD (Group Against the Development) visited JMS and presented their side of the argument, ensuring that students gained a balanced and holistic view of the issue.

Mr Conroy and the Geography team then explored the arguments for and against the reservoir development in subsequent Geography lessons.





Calling Year 9 artists!


The formal deadline for entries for this year's Art Bytes is Thursday 12th February!


STEM Club
