Students will be able to show respect in the use of the planners to ensure they are using them correctly, being on time to lessons, using the planner as a home / school communication tool.

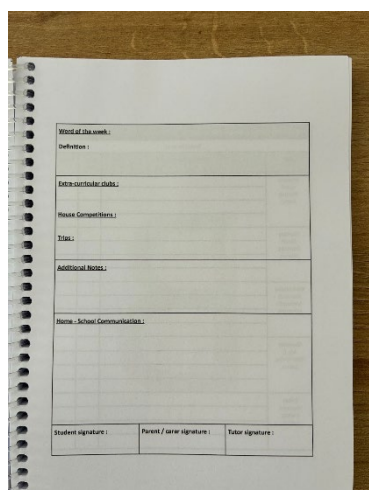
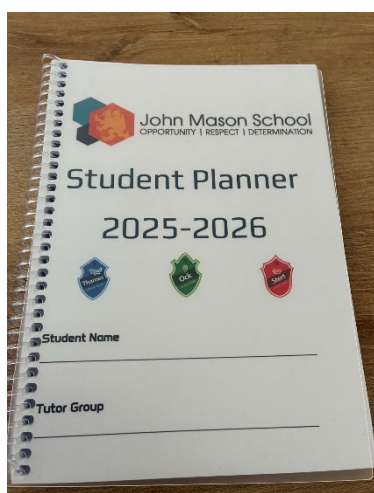

Home-School Communication is there for both staff to acknowledge students work or behaviour, as well as for home to ask questions or to notify the school / teachers of anything.

PE notes for non-participation in lessons has a separate page at the back of the planner. All PE notes need to be written here. It also shows if students have not had the correct kit for their lessons, we ask that you check this whilst signing the planner.
