Dear Families,

Different year groups are following very different pathways as we approach the end of the year and it is a privilege to watch them grow, both as groups, and as individuals. Year 11 and 13 students focus on their academic studies and their external exams. Year 10 and 12 are starting to think about what comes after school, with Year 10 completing Work Experience and Year 12 starting preparations for university applications. Meanwhile on Wednesday we welcomed Narrative Alchemy, a creative and educational theatre production company, who worked with Year 8 and Year 9 students on their Personal Development curriculum, sharing Chelsea's Story.

Chelsea's Choice

Chelsea's Story is an internationally renowned applied theatre play that has proven highly effective in raising awareness around the sensitive issue of Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE). Year 8 and 9 students were glued to the performance and learnt how to look out for the signs of exploitation, look out for themselves and look out for each other.



ChallengED – Team Brick Building Event for Students



On April 30th 2024 120 students gathered in the Larkmead School hall for a morning of collaborative and challenging tasks with local education company House of Fun. The IBrick workshops involved designing and testing two challenging brick builds with a focus on teamwork and engineering. Mixed school groups encouraged students to meet new people and take on different roles within their teams. Students enjoyed

making new friends and spending time working on the tasks as well as modifying their designs and learning from others.

'I enjoyed working with other people I didn't already know.'

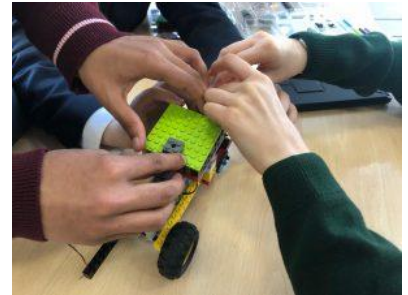
'I liked building the rescue robot because it was something different and fun.'
