- Some topics we are learning now will appear on their final GCSE!





Support for all - homework


- All homework is set on Sparx each week
- It now logs in using the school SSO
- The homework tracks our curriculum and provides practice and support at just the right time for deeper learning
- The AI allows it to adjust to each child's understanding and build from there
- Every question is accompanied by an explanatory video
- Therefore, we expect 100% on all tasks!
- This is a high bar, but achievable for everyone
- If your child is spending more than 45 minutes working on this, please ask them to stop! We will notice, and help.
- Use Target and XP Boost to extend learning or have extra practice






Support for all - home-school partnership

- Homework club LRC after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays
- Homework support in IT1 every Tuesday lunchtime (either pre– or post–deadline)
- Strengths are celebrated and extended in lessons
- Class difficulties are noticed and resolved in real time







Assessment, reporting and grouping

- Students are grouped according to the most appropriate level for their current understanding.
- Everyone follows (roughly) the same broad topics at the same time, but to different depths. For example while one group are finding percentages, another group might be understanding repeated percentage change (eg Investments).
- Students have four assessments over the year.
- For two of these, we will have a pre-test, a review lesson, and then the real test. After this, any remaining learning goals will be in the homebook please encourage them to work on these on Sparx.
- We use assessments and classroom performance to move students between groups whenever necessary. We try to be as flexible as we can.





Assessment protocol

- All marks recorded centrally
- Teacher identifies target topics
- Each test analysed in detail in lesson time
- Students are being trained to critique their strategies as well as their knowledge – it's not just a case of feedback being, "try harder"!
- Students identify target topics and Sparx codes to work on, and record in their **homebook**.





And finally

We have found that because Sparx tracks our curriculum, it is a great way to catch up missed lessons after an absence.








Behaviour for Learning

- Celebration Tea- and other events to come















